Dear Parents, Carers and Children

I would like to start by saying "Hello" to Year 6 – we've missed you! However, Mr Ward and Miss Parry report that they are impressed with the way that the children have tackled their home learning. As the staff are also isolating they have been able to support the children throughout the day and I would like to thank you for the positive feedback we have received about how effective this has been. We are keen to ensure that the children receive high quality remote learning, and Seesaw, alongside the year group emails, has continued to be an effective method of communication.

I realise this is not a situation that any of us would have wanted so early in the term but unfortunately it is happening throughout schools in Leeds. If you receive a positive test result, please email school at any time using office@guiseleyprimary.org; the address is monitored throughout the evening and weekend and will ensure we are able to notify affected year groups as soon as possible.

The daily updates that we receive from the DfE and Leeds City Council are comprehensive (attached are the documents we have received this week) and the guidance below is taken from the Covid-19 Information Pack for Educational Settings in Leeds:-

Advice to give to contacts

1. All identified contacts should be advised to self-isolate at home and not attend school for 14 days from the last point of contact with the case, and monitor themselves for symptoms. If contacts develop a new continuous cough or fever or loss of taste/smell, they should request a test for COVID-19 through gov.uk or via 119.

This document, containing actions for schools, has been written by LCC in conjunction with Public Health England. What we found most helpful last weekend was the DfE Helpline which provided, over the phone, step by step guidance as to how to proceed, including which children needed to self-isolate and when was the earliest that the children and adults could safely return to school. We will continue to follow this advice for the health and safety of all children, families and staff.

Within school, we continue to review the measures we have in place and will keep you fully informed of any changes to procedures. There will be a change to the way that Year 5 and Year 6 children line up in the mornings from 12th October and from Monday the main entrance door will be open for Year 4 to begin to enter the building from 8:55 until registration at 9:00.

There has been some requests for clarification around the KS2 playtime snack. In most classes this is eaten outside in the playground so please could you send the children with a healthy snack which is easy to eat 'on the move'. I would suggest items such as a piece of fruit, carrot sticks, cereal bar, rice cakes, crackers, a slice of fruit bread etc. Please could you ensure your child knows which their snack is as some children have been sneaking out with their lunchtime dessert!

I apologise that the Newsletter has been dominated by Covid-19 and I hope to focus next week on the exciting activities the children have been doing in class. As parents you will naturally continue to have concerns about safety but for the children, they are just loving being back in school, learning and having fun with their friends.

Thank you for your continued support, it has been particularly appreciated this week.
