Dear parents, carers and children

Another week over already and I can't believe that we only have two weeks left of the first half term. We must be having fun!

Year 6 have had another successful week of home learning but we are really looking forward to having you back in school – it's been very quiet! Mr Ward and Miss Parry have done a great job of interacting with the children and I would like to thank them both, as well as the children and yourselves for making this so successful. They have trialled uploading recorded Zoom lessons this week and I take my hat off to them for making the technology work so well!

Talking of technology, as you will know, next week we will be using an online system for the parents' evening appointments for Rainbow, Red, Orange, Yellow, Green, Blue and Indigo classes. Although this has been trialled within school between staff members, this type of system is in its infancy. We are confident that it will run smoothly but if there were to be any technical problems and you lose connection with the staff member, they will get back in touch with you by telephone some time during the week to continue the conversation. Fingers crossed for success!

When the Year 5 and 6 children arrive in school on Monday morning there will be a slight change to the way that they line up. The area in front of school will be divided by a yellow line – please can the Year 5 children line up on the markers nearest to the main entrance and facing the main entrance. The Year 6 children need to line up on the other half of the space, facing their usual entrance into school. There will be staff on hand to help to organise them but it would be helpful if you could pre-warn them please.

Following a request from a parent could I ask that the steps are left clear until the Year 4 children have exited at the end of the day please. If you have a child in high school who comes to collect a younger sibling or meet yourself, would you please ensure they are also aware of the social distancing requirements. I also promised a message for the mornings - now that the door is opening at 8:55 for the Year 4 children, please reassure them that they are not late unless they arrive after 9:00 – there have been some panicked faces when the other children are not there!

Although I can't be in classes as much as I would like I have worn my mask and managed to visit a few lessons this week. All the staff are doing a great job of ensuring business as normal whilst adhering to the measures we have in place. In Reception the children have been focusing on the number '3'. They now know everything there is to know about the number in a range of contexts and what they have particularly enjoyed is inventing stories in the quadrangle to make their calculations more exciting. This forms part of the whole school 'Maths Mastery' approach which is having a positive impact on the depth of knowledge the children have about the number system. This enables them to tackle complex problem solving and reasoning as they progress through school.

Year 1 have been focusing on number bonds and the 'part whole model' and Year 2 have been using place value to add 2-digit numbers. Impressive maths Year 2 and super 'perfect presentation'! Year 2 were also keen to tell me about their exciting week learning about the moon landing and reading about the interesting life of the British astronaut Tim Peake. They are learning the features that are needed to write a newspaper report and I shall look forward to reading them when they are finished. The Year 4 children showed off their impressive knowledge of roman numerals and Year 3 have been making Stone Age tools using wood and junk modelling materials and finishing them with papier mache. A super selection of spears, bows and arrows!

So, it is good to see that school life is returning to some sort of normality. Although we are not able to invite you in at the moment, please remember to complete the permissions form as soon as possible and we can begin to share photos and videos of the activities the children are enjoying on the website – it's Art Week next week!
