Covid-19 Reminders

* If your child has a Covid test over the weekend, please email the test result, even if it is negative, to office@guiseleyprimary.org People who test positive are infectious from 48 hours before symptoms starts, or before the test if they have no symptoms.

* If any member of a household has symptoms and is awaiting a test result, the whole household needs to self-isolate until the test result is received. The whole household must follow the NHS Track and Trace rules and not leave the house or have visitors into your house.

The application process is open until 15th January 2021 for parents and carers to apply for a school place for children born between 1 September 2016 and 31 August 2017. Letters detailing how to apply have been sent directly from Leeds City Council.
