Dear Parents, Carers and Children

This was certainly not the news that any of us wanted to start the new school term. Although I can appreciate why the decision had to be made, the timing was, in my opinion, far from ideal. However, 'it is what it is' as the saying goes and we will do our best to pull together as a school community.

As a school, we pride ourselves in trying to support working parents as far as is possible. However, on this occasion, by following the government guidance and enabling children to attend where at least one parent is a critical worker we have found ourselves in a situation where classes are becoming potentially unsafe for the children and staff within them. I have re-read the guidance and I am now asking you to consider the phrase "Children with at least one parent or carer who is a critical worker can go to school or college if required." My understanding is that the lockdown is to reduce contact and reduce the infection rate and yet we currently have almost 200 children attending school. Other schools that have followed the guidance are in a similar situation and LCC have issued the letter attached which outlines the situation more clearly: "the best action for you to take for your child, yourself and the whole community is to keep your child at home." This is not a message that I like to send to parents but I am urging you to consider if you really have no choice but to send your children into school. As year groups become overcrowded, please don't be offended if we telephone you to ask if both parents are key workers and if there is a possibility of you keeping your child at home to provide space for a vulnerable child.

I would like to thank the teaching staff for the speed at which they have responded to the requirement for remote learning and to yourselves for the positive comments we have received about the quality of the offer. The children who are learning at home are an important part of the class and we are keen that they don't feel excluded or disadvantaged - the work that is delivered in school is the same as is being emailed home and we are investigating other ways that we can keep in touch. If you are unable to access the year group email or Seesaw, please get in touch with the school office as, for safeguarding purposes, we will contact you by telephone (these calls may have no Caller ID) if we have not had any contact with your family.

There have been a couple of parents that have asked about the possibility of producing live lessons; this is something that we have discussed but have decided against, mainly following feedback from parents with children at other schools that have experienced it. Every family is in a different situation – some have children in several classes and would find accessing lessons simultaneously impossible due to sharing devices, issues with younger siblings interrupting the learning as well as the reality of managing a class in school whilst the live lesson is taking place. By using pre-recorded lessons your child can complete their work at their own pace, repeat sections that they may have found more difficult and at a time that suits your own work commitments.

Teachers have commented that where remote learning is working most effectively is with the children and parents that are making good use of Seesaw (please use the year group email if you are having difficulty logging on). Please don't feel that you need to upload every piece of work, but it also gives the opportunity for further questions and support. Please be aware that your child's class teacher may be delivering the activities in school and it will be the year group partner that will be commenting. As there are up to 60 children in a year group, not every piece of work will be commented on or marked but everything is definitely being looked at and appreciated. Also, don't forget Mathletics and TT Rockstars which are great online resources that your child can access independently and can earn them points towards being awarded Mathlete of the Week! Please keep feeding back with aspects that are working well or not so well – we are all learning together.

Other news – children in Early Years and KS1 may bring a small, healthy snack to eat at the mid-morning break, as the government free fruit deliveries have been suspended during school closure. Please put this in a labelled bag/box which can be stored with their water bottle until needed.

I hope you have a lovely weekend and let's keep our fingers crossed for no more snow next week.
